2012: A Year of Promise

Vieques has been suffering from severe budget constraints and extreme local unemployment that have created economic misery and a true depression. But there is some good news and reason to be optimistic about our situation in 2012.

Despite governments' efforts to stimulate the economy from top to bottom, it has taken time to move projects through the stages of planning and into construction. Finally, however, good things are evolving: we have reached the beginning of an explosion of new community projects and programs. Mayor Evelyn Delerme Comacho is overseeing millions of dollars in new construction throughout the island in the coming year.

These projects represent \$4,682,500 worth of work beginning now. Over \$4,000,000 of new road work is being initiated all over the island. Additionally, a contract for \$8,000,000 has been awarded for the re-construction of the new ferry terminal in Isabel Segunda.

Another \$4,000,000 has been earmarked for 1st phase improvements to the unfinished and abandoned sports complex in Lujan. The municipality became owner of the facility (including 52 cuerdas) last year.

Several more projects (totaling over \$4,000,000) are in the process of finishing up or have already been completed this year:

- School of Fine Arts
- o VA (Veterans) clinic
- Cemetary expansion
- Water services to Monte Carmelo
- Malecon (Esperanza)
- o Rehabilitation of the disability center
- Gobeo bridge in Florida

Las Marias has seen the completion of 83 housing units for low income families. So far, 33 families have completed the screening process and are currently enjoying life in Coca Gonzales (\$11,700,000 PR government project). Vetting of the applicants is quite thorough. All units are expected to be filled by March.

Other programs:

- Vieques Basket \$200,000 has been allocated to an extensive island wide basketball program for young people.
- Proyecto Senda (Project Path) a new program to assist those needing medical care on Isla Grande for multiple days. It will enable patients to remain off island as required and bring them back when they are able.
- Under Law 52, 105 government related employment opportunities (jobs) have been authorized for Vieques.

The above progress is the result of much effort on the part of our municipal government and is great news for Vieques. We get many needed improvements and additional economic activities at the same time: a true win-win!
